SUMMARY: The Department of Social Work at the Metropolitan State University of Denver is seeking applicants for four temporary full time Lecturer (Category II) positions with a focus on teaching in one or more of the following areas: Practice, Research, HBSE, Policy, Field and related areas. Applicants are encouraged to have expertise in one or more of the following areas: Mental Health, Behavioral Health, Health Care, Addictions, Children, Youth, Families, Community Organizing, Organizational Change, Power, Privilege and Oppression, Social Work Theory, and Philosophy. Position will be for the 2014/2015 academic year with possible renewal based on funding. This posting is being used to fill four positions in the department of Social Work

RESPONSIBILITIES: Teaching: The successful candidate will have primary assignment to the MSW program and teach in the areas of departmental need and candidate qualifications. Teaching will consist of 24 credits per academic year. Instruction may also include BSW courses. Teaching may include online, face to face, and hybrid instruction; face-to-face instruction may include day, evening, and weekend as needed. The successful candidate may also take on lead faculty responsibilities for specific courses and be responsible to update and modify online and on campus course material. In addition to teaching regularly assigned courses in Social Work, must have the ability to teach about the history, culture, and contributions of U.S. ethnic minorities and other marginalized groups.

Advising: In addition, under reassigned time, the successful candidate will advise a designated load of primarily MSW students and perform foundational advisement for students in the major.

Scholarly Activities: The successful candidate is encouraged to have an active and ongoing scholarly agenda and produce peer reviewed scholarship as a way of staying academically qualified. Reappointment does not depend on scholarly productivity.

Service: The successful candidate will perform service work including work on departmental committees as assigned by the Chair. Candidates are encouraged to maintain an active service involvement in their professional communities as a way of remaining academically qualified. Candidates may be asked to serve on Department, School, or University committees.
