Associate Professor or Professor, School of Social Work

The University of North Carolina at Charlotte invites applications for Associate Professor or Professor of Social Work. The expected start date is August 15, 2017. This nine-month tenured position is at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor, as per the criteria approved by the Board of Trustees of the UNC Charlotte (<http://legal.uncc.edu/policies/up-102.13#s114>) in the School of Social Work (<http://socialwork.uncc.edu/>).

The successful candidate must possess a doctorate in social work or a related field. An MSW from a CSWE-accredited program is highly desired. If a candidate possesses a doctorate in a related field, an MSW from a CSWE-accredited program is required. The candidate must have a strong academic record, achievement in original research and scholarship, success in securing external funds for research, and a commitment to quality teaching. Candidates should also demonstrate an interest in research mentorship with faculty and students. The candidate will have teaching opportunities in the BSW and MSW Programs, as well as the Health Services Research PhD Program. Candidates will also provide service to the University, community, and profession.

The University of North Carolina at Charlotte is North Carolina's urban research university. It leverages its location in the state's largest city to offer internationally competitive programs of research and creative activity, exemplary undergraduate, graduate, and professional programs, and a focused set of community engagement initiatives.
