

ANNOUNCEMENT SOCIAL WORK FACULTY SEARCH

Seton Hill University invites applications for a faculty position in its BSW program beginning in August 2017.

Seton Hill University is a Catholic liberal arts university. The campus is located 35 miles east of Pittsburgh, in Greensburg, PA.

Requirements: A minimum of a master's degree in social work from a CSWE-accredited school, with preference given to a candidate with both MSW and PhD, or an individual who has completed their doctoral work and whose dissertation will be completed by May 2018.

The successful candidate will have at least two years of practice experience. Teaching experience and demonstrated scholarship is desired. The candidate must be eligible for social work licensure in Pennsylvania. Also required is the ability to relate effectively with students, excellent communication and interpersonal skills, effectiveness working with those of other cultures and backgrounds, and good organizational skills. The course load is 4/4, with a two-course release to serve as field coordinator.

Essential functions:

- Teach assigned courses to prepare students for careers in social work or related fields.
- Based on a commitment to liberal arts education, connect liberal arts and social work in teaching.
- Advise and mentor students.
- Contribute to recruiting students and the ongoing growth of the social work program.
- Demonstrate strong interpersonal skills to work effectively with diverse students, faculty and staff.
- Develop relationships with human service organizations in Westmoreland and adjacent counties.

Salary and benefits: Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience. Seton Hill University offers a full range of benefits for faculty, including medical, dental, vision insurance, disability coverage, and contributions toward a retirement plan.
