POSITION TITLE & DESCRIPTION: The Department of Social Work invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor in our MSW Program beginning Fall 2014. The successful candidate will be qualified to teach in several core curricular areas including social work practice (micro, macro, and clinical), human behavior and the social environment, theory, policy, and research. Expertise in social work practice and/or theory is highly desired. Expectations for the position include teaching, supervising student research, academic advising, developing and maintaining an active research agenda, serving on University and Department committees, and developing a record of professional service in the greater community. Positions are contingent upon the availability of authorized funding.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Doctoral degree and Master of Social Work degree required
- Two years post-MSW practice experience
- Demonstrated ability, interest, and active involvement in scholarly activity
- Prior experience in curriculum development
- Commitment to the pursuit of social just ice
- Commitment to empowerment and strengths-based social work practice
- · Ability to work across multiple systems and with diverse populations

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Teaching experience in a graduate social work program is preferred. The ideal candidate would have documented evidence of teaching effectiveness, experience in supervising student research, a developed research agenda, and familiarity with accreditation standards.

Direct social work practice expertise in a particular area such as clinical, health, behavioral health, substance abuse, or gerontology is desirable. Additionally, a potential candidate's consideration will be enhanced by providing evidence of understanding and experience with the Council on Social Work Education standards as they relate to social work education and competency-based assessment.

A complete application must include: an application letter specifically addressing the position description, qualifications, and interest areas; unofficial copies of graduate transcripts; and a professional resume including teaching experience, research experience, publications, and contact information (names, addresses, telephone numbers, and email contact) of three references. Official transcripts will be required prior to a position offer.
