## Announcement of Faculty Positions

Applications are now being accepted for multiple tenure track faculty positions at the assistant, associate, or full professor level. Prior to appointment, all candidates must have an earned doctorate in social work or a related discipline, competence to teach at the MSW and PhD levels; and a commitment to exemplary research, high quality scholarly publications, and preparation of fundable research proposals. An MSW, with two years of practice experience, is preferred. Applicants at the associate and full professor level must have substantial evidence of productive research and of the recent receipt of extramural support. Faculty with any of the following areas of expertise are most strongly encouraged to apply:

- School social work, domestic violence, child welfare, substance abuse, health, aging
- Group, organization, or community interventions
- Nonprofit agency administration
- Practice research with populations that are underserved

The University of Maryland School of Social Work (UM-SSW) ranks among the top 20 schools of social work in scholarly productivity and reputation. The UM-SSW supports excellence in research; provides outstanding BSW, MSW, PhD, and professional education; and demonstrates commitment to the well-being of populations and communities at risk. With an enrollment of over 800 MSW students and more than 40 PhD students, the UM-SSW offers a wide array of teaching opportunities.

The UM-SSW is committed to a racially and culturally diverse faculty and student body. Its educational programs emphasize science-informed clinical and macro practice with diverse client populations.
