Many young children involved with the child welfare system have developmental delays. Findings from a multiyear study of developmental screenings across the Commonwealth showed that 48.7% of children who were screened had a developmental concern; however, less than half of them received Early Intervention services (see http://www.pacwrc.pitt.edu/ASQ.htm for more info). The Alliance for Infants and Toddlers (AFIT) conducts developmental screenings for children involved with child welfare in Allegheny County. They are a rich source of information and a valuable ally for you in your work with young children and their families.
