



The School of Social Work at East Carolina University is seeking applicants for **three** fulltime positions, 2 nine-month tenure track and 1 nine-month teaching instructor, to begin in August 2022. We are seeking individuals who can advance our mission of excellence in social work education through innovative teaching and research; possess a willingness to teach across the curriculum at the graduate (MSW) and undergraduate (BSW) level; who evidence experience or interest in working with students from underrepresented minority groups; and possess a demonstrated commitment to antiracism and anti-oppressive practice and education. Preference will be given to applicants with practice experience and/or research interests in behavioral health or clinical/direct practice. An active LCSW license or equivalent is preferred.

The School of Social Work offers two academic programs, graduate certificates in Substance Abuse and Gerontology, and a licensure in School Social Work. Our degree programs include a Bachelor of Social Work and a Master of Social Work. The School offers advanced standing, traditional MSW, parttime MSW, and off-site parttime MSW degree options. The MSW program is among the highest enrollment graduate programs at ECU.

East Carolina University is an emerging national research university with an enrollment of nearly 29,000 students. The University offers 84 bachelor's degree programs, 71 master's degree programs, 18 doctoral degree programs, and 82 departmental certificates. ECU is comprised of 10 academic colleges/schools including the Brody School of Medicine and the School of Dental Medicine. The University is committed to the creation of a School of Public Health that will focus on addressing regional needs and rural health disparities. ECU is located in Greenville, NC, a diverse and progressive city of approximately 90,000. It is within two hours driving distance to the Atlantic coast to the east and the Research Triangle area of Raleigh, Durham, and Chapel Hill to the west. The College of Health and Human Performance is home to six academic units. Excellent opportunities exist for interdisciplinary research collaborations within the College and across the University. The College employs two fulltime instructional technology consultants, pre and post award grant specialists, and a quantitative methodologist.

Applicants for the tenure track positions must possess an MSW with 2 years post-masters experience, and a PhD or DSW in social work or PhD or equivalent terminal degree in a related field. Candidates with PhD conferred at the time of initial appointment will hold the probationary rank of Assistant Professor. Qualifying degrees must be received from regionally accredited institutions. Applicants for the teaching instructor position must possess an MSW with at least 5 years post-masters experience. A DSW or PhD in social work, or PhD or equivalent terminal degree in a related field is preferred. Qualifying degrees must be received from regionally accredited institutions.
