Applicants must have a PhD in Social Work or a closely related discipline, an MSW from a CSWE-accredited program, and a minimum of two years of post-master's degree practice experience. Applicants should be able to teach across the Social Work undergraduate curriculum and will be responsible for classroom teaching and field liaison work as needed. All applicants should be able to demonstrate strong teaching skills, scholarship, and an interest in community service. Special consideration will be given to candidates with an interest in program leadership and development and social work educational administration.
