- * The Behavioral Health Scholars Program is committed to increasing the trained workforce of graduate-level social work behavioral health providers having the knowledge and skills to meet the needs of children, adolescents, and transitional-aged youth through the prevention and treatment of behavioral health problems.
- * The Center on Race and Social Problems
 Fellows Program is designed to provide
 internship opportunities for social work
 students who are committed to working on
 issues of racial justice.
- ** The Hartford Partnership Program for Aging Education is a unique educational program designed to enhance both direct practice and leadership skills in gerontology.

- ** The Library Social Work Fellowship in collaboration with the Allegheny County Library Association places social work students in public libraries to respond to community needs, particularly in areas of social services, mental health, health/social determinants of health, and other specific to the library service area and populations.
- * The Marc Cherna Fellowship is an exclusive opportunity to gain experience within an organization that designs, plans, organizes and implements human services for over 200,000 people and with a network of providers.
- * The **Roth Fellowship** allows students to develop a deep understanding of the relationship between behavioral health (mental health, substance use) and physical health.

 students from across the U.S., working closely
 with intimate partner violence experts to build
 capacity in local agencies to prevent gender-based
