MSW Fellowships

The University of Pittsburgh School of Social Work offers our MSW students generous fellowships in child welfare, gerontology, behavioral health, substance misuse, gender-based violence, race and social problems, and community engagement.

- * The **Behavioral Health Scholars Program** is committed to increasing the trained workforce of graduate-level social work behavioral health providers having the knowledge and skills to meet the needs of children, adolescents, and transitional-aged youth through the prevention and treatment of behavioral health problems.
- * The **Center on Race and Social Problems Fellows Program** is designed to provide internship opportunities for social work students who are committed to working on issues of racial justice.
- * The **Hartford Partnership Program for Aging Education** is a unique educational program designed to enhance both direct practice and leadership skills in gerontology.
- * The **Library Social Work Fellowship** in collaboration with the Allegheny County Library Association places social work students in public libraries to respond to community needs, particularly in areas of social services, mental health, health/social determinants of health, and other specific to the library service area and populations.
- * The **Marc Cherna Fellowship** is an exclusive opportunity to gain experience within an organization that designs, plans, organizes and implements human services for over 200,000 people and with a network of providers.
- * The **Roth Fellowship** allows students to develop a deep understanding of the relationship between behavioral health (mental health, substance use) and physical health.
- * The **Survivor Link + Public Health AmeriCorps Fellowship** students join a cohort of social work students from across the U.S., working closely with intimate partner violence experts to build capacity in local agencies to prevent gender-based violence and support survivors.
